# **Jesus: Foundation and Transition**

In June, we will recognize the graduates from our congregation. It is a rite of passage for most people. We move from one level of education to another. That next level might be additional formal education or it could be the education of getting the first job on a career path.

But even changes can change. It wasn't so long ago that a person would graduate from high school or college, get a job, and retire from that company in 30 years or so. It wasn't uncommon for people to work their way up through the ranks to higher status within the company. It may have meant a geographical move now and again, but the company stayed the same.

Now, our kids start high school and college to train for jobs that might not even exist when they start their education. Many people won't work for one company and retire, they might not even work one career. Life is becoming more and more unpredictable and transitions are becoming the norm.

The Church finds itself at a crossroads in the midst of all this transition. On the one hand we

serve a God who is the same yesterday, today, and tomorrow. (*Hebrews 13:8*) One the other hand, we believe that God created this ever changing, unpredictable world. (*Genesis 1 & 2*)

Transitions are difficult under the best circumstances. Graduation is a celebration of accomplishment and moving on to the next level. But graduation is also when we leave familiar patterns and people behind for new schools, new jobs, and new communities.

Phyllis Tickle, in her book *The Great Emergence: How Christianity is Changing and Why*, observes that every 500 years in the Christian Church there is an upheaval, a reformation if you will. Where the dominate institutional church is challenged to throw off those things that have become ossified and obscure the Gospel.

Her assertion is that we are in the midst of that cycle right now. We won't know for sure for a few more decades and who knows how this transition will shake out, but there seems to be a move away from a head knowledge (Do you know Jesus?) to a heart knowledge (How have you experienced Jesus?).

Transition is hard, even when it is good. It is good to move from just knowing about to really experiencing Jesus. But just like graduation, transition our way of knowing and experience Christ means we leave behind some of the familiar into encounters with the unfamiliar. It means new people and ideas challenge us and our deeply held beliefs about what it means to be a disciple of Jesus.

Through all the transition, through all the change, through all the chaos that those things bring, we are not alone. History has taught us that in every 500 year reformation, the Church of Jesus Christ emerges stronger and

more effective for the Gospel. That in the midst of our change and transition, Jesus Christ is at work in, with, and under all that is happening.

After the resurrection, Jesus gives the Great Commission to the disciples in Matthew 28. Talk about a transition. Jesus is saying to the disciples — Go! Do the work that I have prepared you for. You have graduated to become workers in the Kingdom of God. But Jesus leaves them with a promise that was good for them and is good for us as we transition to what Jesus has for us in our futures—"And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:16-20)

# **Mobile Meals Ministry Update**

When taking on a new community activity, you expect some novel experiences. While serving sack lunches on Saturday at Gather, I have had some personal firsts: (1) meeting 2 young women who would become murder victims here in Lewis County in the past 6 months, (2) comforting the grieving significant other of one of the victims, and (3) seeing frostbite as a familiar young man showed up in a wheelchair and unexpectedly unwrapped the gauze around his foot to share his blackened toes. He had slept outdoors on a recent freezing night because the carbon monoxide alarm went off in his mother's

trailer. He didn't explain where his mother had been. Our guests' problems just tear at my heart. We do not know where God will lead us or what lessons He has in store for us. I am glad that God is putting our MMM volunteers in a place where we can offer not only needed food and other supplies but unconditional love.

A family's donation of \$300 at Christmas has allowed gradual purchase of 15 cold-weather sleeping bags from Big 5 as 1-day sales greatly reduced the \$80 price. Another family purchased 5 sleeping bags on sale. We often encounter newly homeless

who have been evicted and have no outdoor gear. Used, laundered sleeping bags are welcome especially if they are rated below 30 degrees.

Another ongoing need is for the small single-use hotel toiletries (soap, shampoo, conditioner, lotion) that can fit in a pocket or backpack.

Hygiene is always a challenge. Donations can be placed in the blue bin which is now located in the narthex near the door to the stairs. We can also always use individual packs of chips, cookies, fruit cups, and bottled water. Sue Edwards, Sack Lunch Coordinator


